GREAT PLACE LAKES AND DALES

Great Place Lakes and Dales is a Heritage Lottery Funded programme, exploring ways to support younger people who wish to live and work in the Lakes and Dales, using arts and culture as a catalyst. The aim is to help to reduce the number of young people leaving the area. The population of young people aged 18 to 34 is 17% in the two areas whereas the national average is 26%. We know each village, town and community in the Lakes and Dales has its own strong identity and there are issues around infrastructure, affordable housing and transport but we also know there is a lot of good practice in the business community.

In our role as business animateurs we researched the key issues affecting creative businesses. These can be summarised as:

- Young people being aware of job/work opportunities
- Availability of appropriate work space (shared spaces, hot desking, affordable studio space)
- Different ways of working (remote working, flexible working, collaboration)
- Appropriate business support (designed for the creative industries)
- The visibility of the creative sector in view of exciting opportunities locally and nationally.













LOTTERY FUNDED

We are working with young people to trial solutions to some of the issues they have identified. We would like to extend our conversation to the wider business community to explore long-term solutions. We are keen to hear from local businesses about good practice or challenges around:

- The recruitment and retention of young people in the area
- Working with the creative and cultural sector
- The potential to provide work space or business support for creatives.

We also want to hear about the benefits and challenges of locating a business in the Lakes and Dales.

HERE ARE 6 SIMPLE THINGS TO CONSIDER REMOVING OR REPLACING:

- Plastic bottle
- Single-use plastic cups
- Plastic carrier bags
- Plastic straws
- Single-use plastic cutlery
- Balloons

DON'T STOP THERE!

Think about eliminating plastic disposable cups, 'on the go' plastic food packaging, condiment sachets, single-use promotional items and bathroom plastics.

GET IN TOUCH

Their eco store provides many refill options and plastic-free alternatives, as well as a terracycle recycling station in the basement for crisp packets, toothbrushes, toothpaste tubes, biscuit wrappers and other awkward plastics that can't go in the blue bin.

TWO SISTERS

They switched to paper straws a year ago, stopped selling drinks in plastic bottles and have started making their own dips from scratch to reduce plastic packaging.

BEAN LOVED

They sell bamboo re-usable cups and give customers their first drink in it free, plus 20p off each take-away hot drink in a re-usable cup.

EXCHANGE COFFEE

They offer a discount to customers who bring their own containers when buying tea leaves or coffee beans.

EMMA'S APOTHECARY

They now wrap all their soaps in paper instead of plastic and have started selling shampoo bars to meet recent demand.

DRAKE & MACEFIELD

They've switched to fully recyclable aluminium trays, as well as selling re-usable tubs and actively encouraging customers to bring their own tubs to fill.
